2 Workers Killed by Toxic Fumes: \$266K OSHA Fine

An animal feed company is facing over a quarter of a million dollar fine after two workers were killed by deadly gas while cleaning a rail car, OSHA said.

Inspectors said that neither worker at Agridyne LLC was equipped with an emergency retrieval system before they entered the rail tank car.

Rescue proves fatal

According to local news reports, a worker was cleaning the outside of a tanker when he fell into the open railcar hatch and was quickly overcome by fumes.

The other worker attempted to rescue him.
